SPOTLIGHT ON BUSINESS: Soudex undergoes \$400,000 expansion in New Richmond

NEW RICHMOND: - Soudex Inc., the New Richmond company which specializes in welding, snow removal, excavation and trucking, is expanding its main building for \$400,000. The project started in August and should be complete in the coming weeks.

The construction contract was awarded to Pitts Foundation of Maria and it consists of covering the company's initial building, which was shaped like a dome, with a rectangular structure that adds one-third to the original surface.

"It was a necessity to improve the building, after 45 years of use. The roof was leaking and it will improve our operations. Part of the new space will be used for offices and the other part for our operations. We are keeping the dome. It would have cost an extra \$200,000 to remove it and it is still useful," says manager Francis Leblanc. His brother Rodrigue owns Soudex.

The new building measures 20 feet in width by 135 feet in length and therefore covers 2,700 square feet. The company serves the Bay of Chaleur area with its welding, excavation and trucking activities. The workforce varies a bit but the company employs 12 people on average.

David Philippe and Sylvain Roy want parliamentary commission to counter cancer through prevention

CARLETON: - Only weeks after having successfully fought cancer, Bonaventure riding Member of the National Assembly Sylvain Roy joined by Gaspesian magician David Philippe is spearheading a campaign. Mr. Roy wants to convince Quebec politicians to establish a national strategy to combat cancer, with an emphasis on prevention.

Sylvain Roy is spearheading the petition which was initiated on December 12 by David Philippe. They are asking the members of the National Assembly members "to mandate the (parliamentary) Commission on health and social services to make a summary of past and current governmental actions regarding cancer prevention and elaborate an ambitious action plan to fight that pandemic."

Philippe, must "make Quebec the most advanced North American nation" as far as cancer prevention is concerned.

"Why, in our schools, are we learning the atomic weight of rocks and not food chemistry? Why, when I enter a supermarket, am I under the impression that I come in a chemicals warehouse," asks Sylvain Roy.

At the end of the summer and beginning of the fall, Mr. Roy had to go through 33 radiotherapy treatments and three six-hour chemotherapy treatments in Quebec City in order to fight throat cancer, at the time he should have been conducting his election campaign in Bonaventure. He still won the election, with the help of other Parti Québecois Members of the National Assembly.

David Philippe has been That ambitious plan, in the living with only one lung for mind of Mr. Roy and Mr. the last eight years, due to lung cancer. In 2013, he also successfully fought brain and bone cancer. The doctors gave him a year or two of life expectancy but he embarked on an experimental treatment and it worked perfectly for him.

"I know I smoked a bit but with a good (prevention) base, maybe I could have avoided that genetic mutation (cancer). I take 60 pills per month. Those pills cost \$8,700 monthly. (...) They are not paid by the goverment but through an insurance. However, everybody pays just the same. I will never pay enough taxes to reimburse what I have cost the society. If I can allow the society to avoid other cases like mine, I will," explains the well-known magician.

Sylvain Roy refers to adopting a "coherent national multi-ministry strategy to fight cancer," because he is convinced that currently, the various ministries involved in the cancer issue, namely Health, Education, Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, work in their own corner "through a silo approach," without knowing what the other departments are doing. David Philippe agrees with that statement and gives an example of the necessity to have coherence from one ministry to the other, as part of a prevention approach. "If there is a very dangerous curve on a road, it won't be long before a Transport department employee puts up a sign. (\dots) The solution lies in education. We give helmets to

our kids so they avoid trauma but we go to the grocery store and stuff them with aspartame," he says, about a chemical found regularly in various food.

Cancer will affect one out of two Quebecers during one's life span and every fourth Quebecer will die of cancer, points out Sylvain Roy. That reality makes him confident to convince enough Members of the National Assembly of all parties to have a parliamentary commission, that would take

place ideally in early spring.

"I already talked to the government parliamentary leader, Simon Jolin-Barrette. He is part of a big machine and he was not ready to answer right away. (...) I believe that the CAQ government will be receptive. We were in the opposition with them for four years. We have created a few links. They will be more receptive than the Liberal Party, which made enormous cuts in prevention," concludes Mr. Roy.

Another record summer for tourism on the Coast

NEW RICHMOND: – The Gaspé Peninsula experienced another record summer tourist season in 2018. The number of visitors surpassed the 500,000 mark, and spinoffs reached \$255 million. All the major parameters indicate a n increase in attendance and financial impact.

The Gaspé Peninsula Regional Tourist Association recently released the numbers. According to the association the summer is made up of the months from May to September inclusively.

The management of the Regional Tourist Association say that the exceptional weather in July and August, the economic stability and the fact that some Quebecers have boycotted American destinations, played a role in the results. Moreover, the hardworking of people involved in tourism and the addition of new attractions has also contributed to the good results.

The occupancy rate for accomodations reached 82% in August and 58% in Septem-

ber, compared to 77% and 53.4% for the corresponding periods in 2017. July remained stable at 74%, the same percentage as 2017 but that year was already marked by a record occupancy rate. For the whole season, the occupancy rate climbed from 59.2% in 2017 to 61.9% this year, a record rate since 2000.

Attractions and festivals also performed well. According to a survey conducted with 127 businesses, the increase varies between 2% and 7%.

The network of tourist information booths was also well attended, as 220,000 people made a stop there, a 2.26% increase compared to 2017, which was also a record year.

The Tourism Gaspésie website also experienced a sharp increase in hits as 21% more people consulted the information available on that site, the blog was used by 24% more users. The number of facebook followers increased 8% to reach 62,000. The Instagram account made a 150% jump and now counts 10,000 followers. A tad more than 8,000 people used the holiday planning software to prepare their itinerary.

The Tourism Gaspésie promotional videos were seen by 750,000 people. Québec maritime, the organization in charge of attracting an international clientele, invested up to \$2 million in various publicity campaigns.

The president of Tourism Gaspésie, Nathalie Blouin emphasizes that the organization's "efforts to lengthen the season are fruitful and we notice a significant clientele rise in September. We now want to make gains in June and we adopt measures in that regard."

As for director general Joëlle Ross, "the Gaspé Peninsula represents a prime destination, diversified and welcoming. The promotion of the region is an all year-long activity and the efforts to market it yield significant results. We wish that the members of Tourism Gaspésie will keep working with us."

Tourism Gaspésie has 700 members. In 2018, winter tourism generated spinoffs of about \$75 million. Tourism spinoffs in the region consequently surpassed the \$330 million mark for the year. Until 2015, the annual spinoffs were hovering around \$225 million yearly.

Three lessons about nature from your old Christmas tree

People living in the northern hemisphere have brought trees and boughs into their homes during the holiday season for thousands of years. The evergreens that we decorate during Christmas can represent a celebration of holidays and a reminder that spring will come again.

I'm a Christmas tree traditionalist, and will never give up the ancient ritual of bringing a fresh tree into our home. Each year, Canada's 1,872 Christmas tree farms produce over three million pine, spruce and fir trees. In addition to supporting Canadian famers, Christmas tree plantations provide habitats for songbirds, including the chipping sparrow and American robin.

But what happens to your Christmas tree after the holidays?

We've come a long way since the days when Christmas trees were dumped into landfills. Most municipalities now have programs that chip and compost old trees. Some conservation groups even collect trees to create fish habitats or stop erosion along streams.

These are great ways to recycle your Christmas tree, but you can also let nature recycle your tree in your own backyard. It takes a little longer than hauling it to the curb, but you can give your tree a second life by giving it as a gift to wildlife. This small act of nature conservation can also help your family learn three lessons about how, even in death, trees are an important part of life and renewal in our Canadian forests.

Lesson 1: Gimme shelter

The first step in recycling your tree is easy. Just put it anywhere in your backyard until spring.

Many of us do this anyway when we miss the pick-up for municipal tree recycling.

Your Christmas tree will enrich your backyard ecosystem right away. Evergreens provide important shelter for birds on cold nights and during storms and as a safe place to rest while they visit your feeder.

You can even use your old tree as a bird (and probably squirrel) feeder by redecorating it with pine cones filled with peanut butter, strings of peanuts and suet.

Lesson 2: Downed woody debris

Come spring, your tree will probably have lost most of its needles and be looking like, well, a dead tree. It's time to put your tree to rest and help out your flowers by mimicking what happens with dead trees in forests.

Scientists call trees and branches on the forest floor "downed woody debris" (the cool scientists just say DWD). This debris is not trash. It is an important indicator of healthy forests by providing habitat, sheltering wildflowers, holding moisture and helping build the soil.

You can recreate DWD in your gardens. Cut off the tree's branches and lay them where spring flowers are starting to emerge. Lay the trunk on soil and it will provide a home for many backyard animals. Toads will find shelter under the log, and insects, including pollinators such as carpenter bees, will burrow into the wood.

Lesson 3: Spruce to soil

By fall, you'll start to witness the final stage in the life of your Christmas tree, as the branches and trunk begin to decompose and turn into soil. Many of our Christmas trees, particularly spruce and balsam fir, have very low rot resistance and break down quickly when exposed to the elements. The more contact the cut branches and trunk have with the ground, the faster it will start to be recycled by fungi, insects and bacteria.

> After a few years, not much will remain of your tree. The needles and branches will have returned to soil, and the trunk will be soft with rot. It will just be a memory of your new tradition of backyard Christmas tree recycling.
